

# Cong trying to frighten BJP by saying Pak possesses atom bombs: Shah

SHIMLA, MAY 25 --/ Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK) is a part of India and "we will take it", Union Home Minister Amit Shah asserted on Saturday as he castigated the Congress for trying to "frighten" the BJP by saying the neighbouring country possesses atom bombs. Addressing a rally at Amb in Una district, the heartland of soldiers, he also appealed to people to ensure the victory of the BJP in the by-polls to six Assembly seats for the formation of a BJP government in the hill state, currently ruled by the Congress. Shah said that only a strong government headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi can fight terrorism, ensure economic growth and take care of the poor. "The Congress is trying to frighten us by saying that Pakistan has an atom bomb," Shah told the rally in support of Union minister Anurag Thakur, the BJP candidate from the Hamirpur Lok Sabha seat. "And, today I speak from... Himachal that Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK) hamara hai, hamara rahega aur hum ise lekar rahenge (PoK is ours and it will

remain ours. We will take it)," the Home Minister stated. Shah said that even when Article 370 was scrapped in 2019, Congress leaders said it would lead to a bloodbath but not even a single stone was pelted in Jammu and Kashmir. During the Congress regime, terrorists from Pakistan used to intrude into India, trigger blasts and return, Shah said, adding this completely changed under the Modi government. "We conducted surgical strikes and wiped out terrorists in their homes which put an end to such tactics," he said, referring to Uri and Pulwama incidents during the BJP rule. Only a leader like PM Modi can put an end to terrorism and Naxalism, he added. "Ensure the victory of BJP candidates in six Assembly

by-elections for the formation of a BJP government and see the lotus (BJP's poll symbol) blooming in Himachal," he said. The Home Minister also mocked the Congress by asking the crowd as to who will be the Prime Minister if the grand old party comes to power. Shah said PM Modi has already won 310 seats in the first five phases of the Lok Sabha polls, and the sixth and seventh phases would help the NDA achieve the target of '400-paar' (400-plus seats), while Congress leader Rahul Gandhi would be restricted at just 40 seats. Shah referred to the implementation of the 'one rank, one pension' by the Modi government and said the Congress did not accept the demand of ex-servicemen but Modi not only accepted it but

disbursed Rs 1.25 lakh crore to the pensioners so far. Lauding the achievements of Thakur, who is seeking a fifth term from the Hamirpur Lok Sabha seat, Shah said even if "you search with a lamp, you will not find a towering leader like him". He listed Thakur's achievements like the Rs 10,000-crore Kiratpur-Ner Chowk four lane project, Rs 1,200-crore worth Hamirpur-Dharampur Highway, Rs 1,000-crore worth Bilaspur-Leh railway line and Rs 2,000-crore bulk drug park and Rs 1,500 crore for AIIMS in Himachal Pradesh. Two governments would be formed -- one at the Centre and the other in Himachal Pradesh -- after the election results are announced on June 4, he said, adding that according to his information "Rahul Baba would go to Bangkok on June 6 for relaxation". Shah said while there were scams worth Rs 12 lakh-crore against people associated with the UPA, corruption allegation of not even a single penny has been levelled against PM Modi and that is why the nation wants a third term for him. # TN police arrests six Hizb-ut-Tahrir activists for campaign against elections, democracy

CHENNAI, MAY 25 --/ Six members of Hizb-ut-Tahrir (HuT), an international Islamist outfit have been arrested for anti-national activities such as propaganda against holding elections and democracy, police said on Saturday. The arrested persons are -- a man in his fifties, his two sons and three others who were aged between 26 and 33, a senior police official said adding provisions of Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA) have been invoked against them. "What began as a modest exercise to seek support from followers of Islam for pan-Islamic rule or the Caliphate appeared to grow strong as number of participants in closed-door meetings increased," he said. "The group was arrested following their propaganda against conduct of elections, democracy; and participation in the voting exercise and the topic of a propaganda was whether elections were Haram (forbidden by Islamic law) or Halal (lawful under Islamic law) and the verdict was that election and democracy were Haram," the senior

official told PTI. One of the arguments of HuT members against democracy was that democracy and rule of law was man-made and hence subject to change and not perfect. However, divine law does not fall into such a category and it is supreme. The arrested persons include Hameed Hussain, who holds a doctorate in Mechanical Engineering and till 2021. He had been teaching engineering in colleges. Hussain's father Ahmed Mansoor and brother Abdul Rehman and three others -- Mohammed Maurice, Khader Nawaz Sheriff and Ahmed Ali -- were also held. All the six men are natives of Chennai. Hameed Hussain has been posting videos on YouTube advocating his ideology and his father Mansoor held private meetings to further the same cause. "It all began with an initiative to translate Zakir Naik's (fundamentalist Islamic preacher who fled India years ago) preachings into Tamil," the official said. The six HuT members were arrested by Chennai police (cyber crime) in an operation closely coordinated by intelligence sleuths. "Central intelligence agencies are aware of developments related to HuT," the official added. (PTI)

# India likely to send tigers to Cambodia this year

NEW DELHI, MAY 25 --/ India is likely to send four tigers to Cambodia by November-December to help reintroduce the big cats in the country's forests, sources said on Friday. New Delhi signed a pact with Phnom Penh for the world's first transnational tiger reintroduction project in November 2022. Officials from Cambodia, the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) and the Indian ambassador to Cambodia, Devyani Khobragade, participated in an online meeting a few days ago and discussed the proposal to send four tigers to Cambodia by November-December. However, a final decision is pending, a source said. "There is continuous dialogue with Cambodian officials regarding the proposal. The NTCA has requested them to send a detailed action plan. The same will be examined and placed before the technical committee," NTCA Member-Secretary Gobind Sagar Bharadwaj told news agency PTI. An appropriate decision will be taken by the competent authority based on the technical committee's recommendations, he added. Another source said the plan is to send four tigers -- one male and three females -- from India's Western Ghats to the Cardamom Hills in the southwestern region of Cambodia. According to the World Wildlife Fund (WWF), conservationists in Cambodia declared tigers "functionally extinct" in 2016. Cambodia's last tiger was seen on a camera trap in the eastern province of Mondulkiri in 2007. In September 2017, the Cambodian government announced plans to reintroduce tigers in the country with the help of the WWF. Cambodia lost all its tigers due to poaching, habitat loss and other factors. India is ensuring that all factors responsible for this are addressed and that conditions are conducive for the reintroduction of tigers, the first source said. Officials had earlier said the two countries would follow all the protocols of the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) for the tiger reintroduction programme. The number of tigers in India stood at 3,682 in 2022, according to the latest government data. This is around 75 per cent of the global wild tiger population. India launched Project Tiger on April 1, 1973 to promote tiger conservation. Initially, it covered nine tiger reserves spread over 18,278 square kilometres. Currently, India has 55 tiger reserves covering more than 78,735 sq.km (approximately 2.4 per cent of the country's geographical area) of the tiger habitat. (PTI)

# First-time voters cast their ballot for change and better future

NEW DELHI, MAY 25 --/ Excited first-time voters in Delhi flaunted their inked fingers after exercising their ballot in the Lok Sabha polls and were unanimous in their demand for better employment opportunities in the government sector and changes in the country's education system. Over 2.52 lakh first-time voters cast their maiden votes in the elections in the city. At many polling booths, the first-time voters were also awarded certificates. Senior Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra's daughter Miraya, a first-time voter, cast the ballot along with her brother Raihan and said the youth should come out and vote for a change. Accompanied by their parents, the two cast their votes at a booth on Lodhi Road in the New Delhi constituency. "My only message to the youth is to just come out and vote. It is our job to make a change so we need to come out and do it," Miraya told PTI Videos. Asifa, a first-time voter at Jafrabad area, said she

has been following the developments related to elections like the announcement of candidates and poll alliances even before the polls were announced. "I am proud to have cast my vote today," she said. Radhika Shukla, a first-time voter and a student of Miranda House, said: "We cannot ask the government for everything. In addition to other issues like development opportunities and women's safety, this generation's youth also wants that environmental issues should be addressed." She is the daughter of Special Commissioner of Police (crime) in Delhi Police Shalini Singh. Her father Anil Shukla is also an IPS officer. Vibha Kumari, who is pursuing her graduation from the Delhi University, cast her vote at the Nirman Bhawan polling booth. "I am a first-time voter and it was a very smooth experience. The polling authorities had made good arrangements. After casting our votes, we were given

coconut water packs to beat the heat," she said. There were several first-time voters who made their choices after reading the manifestos of various parties and doing their research. Madhu Kumari, who exercised her franchise at the polling booth in Nirman Bhawan, said: "If you want a better country, each and every vote is very important. I am proud to be a first-time female voter. I read the manifestos of each of the parties and everything related to women's safety, education, and the police. For my future and the current needs, it is essential to cast one's vote." Sameer Khan (21), who cast his vote at the centre in Kendriya Vidyalaya in President's Estate, said he wants that the government should work towards increasing job opportunities for the youth in the public sector. "There is a dearth of permanent jobs in the government sector something that is affecting us," he stressed. There were some others,

who cast their votes on the basis of the voting choices of their family. Vansh Sharma, a 20-year-old, who voted at a polling centre in Kinari Bazar, said: "I have cast my vote on my family's choice. We have been voting for one party for ages. My MP has worked well for the development of this area." In Mangolpuri's Q Block, which falls in Northwest Delhi constituency, the first-time voters Varsha and Mausam got the opportunity to cast their votes in the school premises from where they had passed their Class 12. "We are lucky that our voting centre fell in our school only," said Varsha, who is pursuing graduation from a Delhi University college. Mausam, who is married now, said, "Our school building has been rebuilt. We want more such schools." A voter turnout of 53.73 per cent was recorded till 5 pm in Delhi, where polling is underway for its seven Lok Sabha constituencies on Saturday. (PTI)

# Box story with pic: NSA Ajit Doval Doval suggests jointness among central armed police forces

NEW DELHI, MAY 25 --/ National Security Advisor (NSA) Ajit Doval on Friday suggested that various central armed police forces of the country should have "jointness" and interoperability among themselves like the ongoing plan for the defence forces. The about 10 lakh strength central armed police forces include the BSF, CRPF, ITBP, CISF and SSB apart from the NDRF and NSG and they are deployed for rendering a variety of internal security duties in the hinterland and at the borders. "Should we think about the jointness in our CPOs (central police organisations). Jointness where we can have interoperability in weapons and other things. We are a huge force now. We have also got the same type of duties, inter-mingling duties at many places whether it's a question of procurement, communication training, standardisation," he said. In defence forces it (jointness) is being done now. We are thinking of theatre commands. One officer from the Air force probably controlling the Navy and Air force and in many areas that jointness has been brought about. There (in defence forces) it was more difficult because their

equipment is very difficult, their doctrines are different, their command and control systems are different but here (CAPFs) it is almost the same, Doval said. "So, if we bring (jointness in CAPFs), we not only save money and it is not for saving money it also brings about greater homogeneity. "Whenever the requirements are there, either in war or in peace. If we find we have to deploy 30 battalions of CPOs doesn't matter. If BSF battalions are not available, CRPF can also do the same thing. Their equipment, training, communication, frequencies are the same...they will march," Doval said, making it clear that this was his personal idea as a police officer and as a man of security and not as an NSA. He was delivering the Rustamji Memorial Lecture organised by the Border Security Force (BSF) on its 21st investiture ceremony. He said border guarding forces like the BSF had a very important role to play in ensuring the country's security. K F Rustamji was the founding father and the first director general of the BSF, the world's largest border guarding force with

about 3 lakh personnel tasked to guard Indian borders with Pakistan on the west and Bangladesh on the east. Doval also said India would have progressed at a much faster pace had its borders been more secure, defined and not under "adversarial dispossession", highlighting that the country's power has grown immensely over the last 10 years. "India's economic progress probably could have been faster if we had more secure borders. In the foreseeable future I don't think that our borders are going to be as secure as we will require for our fast economic growth. "So, the responsibility on the border guarding forces becomes very very heavy. They have got to remain on alert 24x7 and they have got to see our national interest..." the NSA said. Borders not only determine the limit of our sovereignty, they are not only important for our territorial integrity but they also have an impact on our internal security and stability, Doval, a former head of the intelligence bureau (IB), said. "The limit of our sovereignty is the place at the border where our soldier is able to go and put his foot down. Zameen par jo kabza hai woh apna hai, baki toh sab adalat or kachahri ka kaam

hai. Usse farak nahi padta (The land which is in our possession is ours, the rest is legal matter and is immaterial)," the NSA said. Doval told a gathering comprising various CAPF and other central police organisations heads and personnel that "retardation" related to national security need to be checked as a good number of countries have undergone degradation because of "one single factor" like internal instability. Pakistan got broken into two because it could not manage the internal security in its eastern wing, he said, citing example of the Soviet Union that was "balkanised" into various other countries and some African countries. "When we do strategic planning and thinking, it is necessary for us to estimate and have clarity about our borders," he said. Doval said it was important for a country like India to keep a check on the retardation as the country has achieved much in the last ten years. "When somebody will be writing the history of this country...they will be able to see that accretion in national power was achieved and amongst the retardation (was) vulnerability of our borders was a major factor," the NSA said.
